Target 8.7 of the UN Sustainable Development Goals

“Take immediate and effective measures to eradicate forced labour, end modern slavery and human trafficking and secure the prohibition and elimination of the worst forms of child labour, and by 2025 end child labour in all its forms.”



The global challenges - Forced labour and child labour in the world

50 million people are victims of modern slavery. This includes:

- 28 million people in **forced labour**
- 22 million people in **forced marriage**

160 million children are in **child labour**

Of which, 79 million are in **hazardous work**

Alliance 8.7

A global partnership that takes immediate and effective action to eradicate forced labour, modern slavery, human trafficking and child labour, in line with SDG Target 8.7.

Strategic Objectives

Alliance 8.7 is a **catalyst**. If we work together, pooling knowledge, skills, experience and resources, we will see a step change in the impact of our efforts.

Alliance 8.7 Pathfinder Countries

- Pathfinder Countries commit to go further and faster to achieve SDG Target 8.7 by **accelerating efforts**, trying **new approaches** and **collaborating** with others.
- All UN member States have committed to do more, and Pathfinder status is **open to any country**, regardless of its development level.
- Pathfinder countries are guided by an **Accountability Framework**, which sets out the steps in developing, implementing and monitoring **national Roadmaps** to accelerate progress.
- At its core is a **whole-of-government** and **multi-stakeholder approach** and **coordination mechanism**, involving, among others, government representatives, worker and employer organizations, UN agencies, survivors and survivor networks, CSOs, private sector actors and academic development partners
